May 2024 – From the Pastor's Desk

As I write this, I am at the Bishop's Convocation at Seabeck Conference Center. The weather is beautiful and so are the views – water, trees, sunlight; what's not to like?! This year's theme calls for courageous conversations, as we are headed into a polarized election. How do we as Christians respond to the political polarization we are experiencing?

Our speakers for this convocation are speaking on Christian Nationalism. It's a topic I would prefer not to talk about because of its polarization. But it is important to understand what we mean when we say Christian Nationalism, and not assume those we are talking with hold the same understanding. One of our presenters is a PLU professor, specializing in church history, shared the history of Christian Nationalism going back to the 18th century, including the Civil War era. We reflected on Scripture and the way Jesus opposed the systems which oppressed the people. He did not call for retaliation, but a change that honored the dignity of humanity, grounded in God's love for all people.

What I wonder, and ask you to consider is how can we hold in tension opposing views without judgment? Can we listen with an open mind? We are all God's people – called to love all people, including those we disagree with, and even those we consider our enemy. As we journey through this election season, I ask you to pray for your enemies – for God's protection and love for them and all people.



Council Notes May 2024

During the Call Meeting held on April 7, 2024, the congregation voted to call Rev. Pam Karas as Pastor of Faith Lutheran Church and increasing her compensation to meet the ELCA guidelines for a half time pastor.

During the Annual Congregational Meeting held on April 7, 2024, the congregation voted on a plan for the use of the proceeds from the sale of 701 Madison St. The congregation has decided to pay off the mortgage, replace the roof of the Fellowship Hall (it is 25 years old), replace the furnace at the back of the sanctuary (it is 40 years old), make a charitable donation to the Synod, and invest a portion of the remaining assets in funds selected for their safety and best interest rates.

The Faith Community Dinners on Tuesdays are serving each week between 160 and 200 meals. Our volunteers have fun together while working very hard planning the meals, collecting the ingredients, cooking the food, filling the to-go containers, packaging everything in brown bags, and handing them out to our guests. We serve elderly and disabled adults as well as many families with children.
